# BUFFALO CREEK GUN CLUB MEETING MINUTES February 12, 2002

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:15PM.
- 2. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the January minutes as presented in the Newsletter.
- 3. TREASURER'S REPORT
  - No report
- 4. MEMBERSHIP REPORT
  - Copies of the updated membership list were distributed to the board.
  - An application was received from Tony Jordan; a sponsor and fees are needed.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Membership report as presented.
- 5. NEWSLETTER REPORT
  - 150 newsletters mailed out; none returned.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Newsletter report as presented.
- 6. CMP REPORT
  - CMP remains seasonally inactive.
  - Jim Starr needs information on CMP's Junior Travel Support program. Some Colorado juniors may be eligible for support funds this year.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the CMP report as presented.

## CLINIC REPORT

- New AR-15 rifles have been ordered for use in the clinics.
- Work on reorganizing the clinic program continues; Mike Bevelhimer and Mike Walton are establishing the new outline and contacting personnel.
- Additional publicity efforts at gun shows and elsewhere will be necessary to properly launch the new AR-15 High Power clinic program
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Clinic report as presented.
- 8. SILHOUETTE REPORT
  - No report.
- 9. HIGHPOWER REPORT
  - No report.
- 10. **JUNIOR REPORT** 
  - The \$1500 net proceeds from the last raffle will be used as seed money for the next raffle.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Junior report as presented.
- 11. RANGE OFFICER'S REPORT
  - Sunrise Waste Removal must be notified that the club no longer will use its services.
  - Pine Junction Disposal will be contacted to take over trash removal; their fee is \$100/month.
  - The metal plates for new range signs have been prepared and are ready for painting.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Range Officer's report as presented.
- 12. SMALLBORE REPORT
  - Three-quarters of the season is completed, and a fun shoot is scheduled at the Cherry Creek range on Valentine's Day.
  - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Smallbore report as presented.
- 13. OLD BUSINESS
  - Kent Beach reported the gun show sale of all 27 of the club's ammo cans at \$4 each. Kent thanks Rick Cummelin and Jim Harbin for allowing him to use their table at the show.
  - All M-1 and M-1 Carbines have been inspected and priced for sale to members.

- 5 M-1's and one carbine are in need of repairs for malfunctions.
- Letters of intent to purchase rifles have been arriving daily; 16 rifles have been bid on so far. Reminder: Bids must be made in writing to Kent Beach.
- Mike Bevelhimer will take care of preparing affidavit/liability forms for the rifle sales.
- Kent Beach has researched the purchase of cleaning supplies for the new AR's and will send in orders. He expects to purchase four sets of cleaning materials at a total cost of \$550, which includes savings from bulk orders through a cooperating gunsmith.
- Mike Walton presented the Lavelle Trophy for the board's approval. The Tour Champion in 2001 is BCGC member Shawn McKenna with an aggregate of 2824-85x, and the Master Champion, also a BCGC member, is John Volk with an aggregate of 2273-80x. No awards were given for other classifications this year. Notice to Marksmen, Sharpshooters, and Experts...Register for the 2002 Lavelle Trophy competition! You too could win a championship trophy in your classification!
- Jim Starr reported that the company he works for can supply new regulation range flags at cost, and the board approved the purchase without a vote.
- Mike Walton reported that he has contacted an electronics consultant, Willard Crary, and
  discussed the club's intent to purchase a wireless communication system for the range. In April
  they will test suitable wireless systems at the range, and Mike will follow with a purchase
  recommendation to the board.

#### 14. NEW BUSINESS

- Mike Walton discussed plans for a new Junior award in honor of Jim Starr for his twenty and more years of service to Colorado Junior High Power programs. The award will be a once-in-a-lifetime award given annually to the Colorado Junior Service Rifle competitor at Camp Perry with the highest aggregate in the President's 100, National Individual Trophy, Whistler Boy, 6 Man Team, and NRA Board matches (4200-420x possible). The trophy, a life-sized bust of Jim, has been commissioned from the Englewood sculptor, Don Budy, and will be paid for by individual donations from Jim's many grateful friends, fellow shooters and former junior team members. The names of those who donate will be engraved on a Contributor's plate on the base of the sculpture.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to initiate the Starr Trophy as a BCGC sponsored award program, and to open a Starr Trophy Fund for the collection of donations. Notice: Those who wish to donate to the fund may mail a check payable to BCGC Starr Trophy Fund.
   Donations of \$50 to \$100 are suggested. (The total cost of the trophy will be approximately \$2500.)
- The board discussed a request from the Boulder Police Swat Team for use of the range on August 19th and 20th. It was determined that a member will have to be present and that a fee of \$5 per shooter will be collected for the General Fund. It was also stipulated that all rounds must go into the impact area and that the swat team must police up its own brass.
- A change of positions among board members was discussed following Perry Welch's suggestion that he could better serve in a different capacity due to his increasing employment travel responsibilities.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to name Mike Bevelhimer President and Perry Welch a Director at Large.
- Jim Starr will continue to serve as Junior Executive, but the board is seeking two more volunteers to share the responsibilities of running the Junior program.
- Dabney Crump will again handle the arrangements for the annual dinner next year. It will be scheduled for Saturday evening, January 11<sup>th</sup>.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 PM.

# BUFFALO CREEK GUN CLUB MEETING MINUTES March 12, 2002

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:19PM.
- 2. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the February minutes as presented.

#### 3. TREASURER'S REPORT

- \$7,026.54 and \$5470.07 in the club's two CD's and \$7055.14 in the checking account yield total assets of \$19,551.75. The club has earned \$250 in net income so far this year.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Treasurer's report as presented.

### 4. MEMBERSHIP REPORT

- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept Stuart Berens and Steve Kim as new members.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Membership report as presented.

#### 5. NEWSLETTER REPORT

No February newsletter was published as the February issues are combined this year.
 A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Newsletter report as presented.

#### 6. CMP REPORT

- The CMP's 03-A3 sale is now in on with a wide variety of rifles available.
- Drawings for the club's M-1/M-1 Carbine sale are complete and all rifles have received bids.
- Two of the club's M-1's and two carbines were stolen from Kent Beach's van on 3/12/02. Kent had just test-fired them at the Aurora Gun Club, and the police suspect he may have been followed when he left. Adjustments in the sale plans were made.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to sell the rifles to members who won the drawing.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the CMP report as presented.

## 7. CLINIC REPORT

- Mike Walton and Mike Bevelhimer explained the format of the new High Power Rifle Clinic to the board. Each of four clinics will focus on one position/match: Sitting RF (May 25<sup>th</sup>); Standing SF (June 22nd); Prone RF (July 6<sup>th</sup>); and Prone SF (Sept. 14<sup>th</sup>). A different Master Coach will lead instruction at each clinic, and a safety briefing and instruction in AR-15 operation and shooting fundamentals, field stripping and cleaning will also be provided at each clinic.
- It was proposed to continue the practice of leasing club rifles to members (in this case, AR-15's), provided that they have completed all four of the HP Clinics. Members would have the option of purchasing rifles at cost at the end of the lease term.
- Prizes for high scoring clinic participants were proposed: a waiver of \$40 membership or initiation fees for members and non-members respectively.
- Mike Walton proposed using handloaded ammunition with moly-coated bullets for the clinics to provide accurate, clean ammo that would be affordable, function effectively at 300 and 600 yards, speed up cleaning, and prolong barrel life. The projected cost is \$.16 to \$.20 per round. Mike would do the loading this year and keep full documentation of materials, specifications, hours and actual costs. In the future the work would be shared for workday credit among other members with progressive loaders.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the new High Power Rifle Clinic program as presented.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Clinic report as presented.

#### 8. SILHOUETTE REPORT

### 9. HIGHPOWER REPORT

- The board discussed the NRA's official requirements for running a High Power match, addressing some needs for this season's events.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the High Power report as presented.

- No progress has been made on trash removal yet.
- The new pulleys for the target carriers are being prepared for welding.
- The metal plates for new range signs have been prepared and are ready for painting.

- Dan Gabel still has picnic bench construction and other offsite work day projects for interested members to take on.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Range Officer's report as presented.

- This season's shooting will be completed by Wednesday, March 20<sup>th</sup>.
- The annual dinner meeting will be held at the Country Buffet in Englewood (Phar-Moor Plaza) on Wednesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> at 6:30. All interested BCGC members are welcome.
- A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Smallbore report as presented.

# 1. HIGHPOWER SERVICE RIFLE CLINICS

Buffalo Creek Gun Club will be hosting a Highpower rifle clinic series throughout the summer of 2002. These clinics have been designed to cover all aspects of highpower service rifle competition shooting. The clinics will each include an informative lecture on safety, handling, and function of the AR15 rifle. At the close of the day participants will learn to field strip and clean the AR15. Each event will focus on one of the four positions used when shooting in competition, and are scheduled as follows:

May 25, 2002: 200 yard SITTING RAPID FIRE;

June 22, 2002: 200 yard OFFHAND (Standing) SLOWFIRE;

August 31, 2002: 300 yard PRONE RAPID FIRE; September 14, 2002: 600 yard PRONE SLOW FIRE.

Buffalo Creek Gun Club will furnish "National Match Grade" AR15 rifles and ammunition for these clinics. Each shooter will be coached, one-on-one, by an NRA classified competitor. The price for these clinics is \$35.00 each or \$120.00 for the series (Pre-paid), ammunition included. If you wish to be instructed using your own service rifle you will be allowed to do so. However, BCGC will only be able to furnish ammunition for those rifles using the .30-06 or .223 cartridge. Any other rifles will require you to furnish your own ammunition. Upon completion of this series, you will be fully prepared to confidently enter any NRA Highpower service rifle competition.
