1. The meeting was called to order at 7:14PM.

 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Treasurer's report as presented.
4. MEMBERSHIP REPORT
 - The new workbond policy goes into effect this month: \$40 annual dues/\$50 annual workbond with the workbond excused for those who sign up a new member.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept Andrew Suedkamp as a new member
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Membership report as presented.
5. NEWSLETTER REPORT
 - 151 newsletters mailed out; none returned.
 - January/February is a combined newsletter.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Newsletter report as presented.

 - There is not much activity at CMP this time of year – little to report.
 - No .22 ammunition is currently available.
 - Some .30 Ball and .30 Carbine ammunition is still available.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the CMP report as presented.

2. BCGC Firearms for Sale to Members in Good Standing

BCGC IS OFFERING ALL OF THE CLUB'S .30 CALIBER RIFLES FOR SALE.

They will be initially offered to club members in good standing only. Rifles offered for sale are as follows:

- 4 - M1 full match rifles in 30.06
- 21 - M1 service rifles in 30.06
- 9 - M1 carbines in .30 caliber

The proposed method of sale is as follows: A list of all rifles will be compiled with a full description and sale price of each. This list will be posted on the BCGC web site at www.bcgcc.com/club. A hard copy of this list can be obtained by sending a self addressed stamped envelope to Kent Beach. The intent to purchase one or more of the club rifles must be submitted, in writing, to: Kent Beach, 13959 W CEDAR PLACE, GOLDEN CO 80401. You can reach Kent during the day on his pager at 303-310-6363, or you can call (and/or leave a message) on his home phone 303 279-2668, between the hours of 0900 – 2200. Please call if you have any general questions about the sale or specifics about a particular rifle. If it is felt necessary, Kent Beach will designate a day when the rifles may be inspected at his home. If there is more than one member interested in the same rifle, that rifle will be sold to the member chosen by a drawing between the interested members. Two board members will hold the drawing and the winning member will be notified by telephone. Payment must be in cash, cashier's check, or money order. All sales will be completed within one week of notification or the rifles will be sold to other interested members, again, using the drawing system, if needed. The tentative date for the sale is March 12, 2002.

All rifles were obtained through the DCM/CMP program. The match rifles have been re-barreled and completely rebuilt by McCoy in California. All have heavy Krieger match barrels, Bedded stocks, unitized hand guards, National Match sights front & rear with hoods, trigger jobs breaking at 4 1/2 – 5 #, gas systems tightened to match specs, NM leather slings. None of these rifles have seen many rounds since being built. All are "service rifle legal".

Service rifles range in condition from near-new rebuilds to guns that have a fair amount of wear. All rifles have been gauged with an armorer's set of gauges, and all bores are bright and shiny. All rifles are government rebuilds and are, therefore, not original. As such, they are what are known to collectors as "mix masters", i.e.: rifles rebuilt after the Korean War with refinished or new parts that met military specifications and no consideration was given to matching parts according to manufacturer or serial number range. With the exception of one, the carbines are considered to be in excellent condition. Several appear to have original
