BUFFALO CREEK GUN CLUB MEETING MINUTES July 10, 2001

1. The meeting was called to order at 7:39 PM.
2. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the May minutes.
3. TREASURER'S REPORT
 - The Treasurer being absent, there was no July Treasurer's Report.
 - The June Treasurer's report showed a checking account balance of \$6,696.76 and \$7,026.54 and \$5307.15 in CD's for a sum of \$19,030.45 in total assets.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Treasurer's report as presented.
4. MEMBERSHIP REPORT
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept Frank Campbell and Matt Martin as new members.
 - Long time member Tom Slocombe passed away on Jan. 3, 2001.
 - Approximately 25 members have not renewed; they will be contacted one final time by mail.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Membership report as presented.
5. NEWSLETTER REPORT
 - No June newsletter was sent since there was no June meeting.
 - 155 newsletters were sent in May; 1 was returned.
 - Match reports for the Spring, Anniversary and Regional matches will be published in the next newsletter.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Newsletter report as presented.
6. CMP REPORT
 - Participants in the Garand Match at Camp Perry this year have the opportunity of borrowing a CMP M-1 for use in the match, with the option of purchasing the rifle afterwards for \$500. As an additional incentive, those who purchase a rifle are eligible to purchase up to 4000 rounds of .30 ball ammo at just \$.10 a round.
 - The club has received its CMP affiliation certificate.
 - The club is eligible to purchase 6500 rounds of .22 Federal ammunition.
 - CMP has new forms available for those sponsoring Garand Matches.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the CMP report as presented.
7. CLINIC REPORT
 - 16 shooters and 9 coaches participated in the AR-15 clinic held on Sat. June 23rd.
 - 14 shooters participated in the M-1 clinic on July 7th; Mike Bevelhimer and John Pentycfe were the only coaches.
 - Conflicts in clinic scheduling were discussed; next season's clinic schedule may be adjusted to avoid conflicts with holidays and to separate clinic dates from match dates.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Clinic report as presented.

 - Three of next year's matches already have sponsors; a sponsor is still needed for the Anniversary Match.
 - Thanks go to Jim Starr, and John Volk for conducting matches, and special thanks go to Andrew Carroll and Tammy Crist for assisting with statistics.
 - A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Highpower report as presented.

- Trash has been removed; the problems with Sunrise Disposal have been resolved.

 - Ray Barrett proposed that the club schedule instructional team matches as well as clinics. This will be considered at a future meeting when more officers are in attendance.

CHALLENGE FEE: \$ 1.00

SQUADDING: Squadding tickets will be available at 7:00 AM of the Match date. Every reasonable attempt will be made to squad competitors with like classifications on the same or successive relays. Late entries will be squadded at the discretion of the match sponsor.

General Information:

RANGE LOCATION: The Buffalo Creek Gun Club range is located 11 miles southeast of Bailey Colorado, in the Pike National Forest. Turn east from Highway 285 at the Bailey Propane Co. in Bailey.

RANGE FACILITIES: Camp sites are available, however there is no water, so bring your own. Toilets are primitive.

DUTIES: Competitors will score and work the pit.

CLASSIFICATIONS and RULES: NRA Rifle Classifications will be used. Current NRA Highpower Rifle rules.

RIFLES & AMMUNITION: Service Rifle (rule 3.1, 3.1.1, or 3.1.2) or Any Rifle (rule 3.2). Any ammunition except tracer or incendiary.

POSITIONS and TARGETS: Standing position (5.6), Sitting or Kneeling (5.8 or 5.10), Prone (5.12). At 200 yards - SR target, At 300 yards - SR3, At 600 yards - MR

SIGHTING SHOTS: Sighting shots must be shot and scored.

Awards will be determined by the match sponsor.

Match Operation & Schedule

COURSE OF FIRE: 50 shot NMC with sighters.
Firing will begin 9:00 AM on the morning of the match.

Stage 1: 200 yards, standing position, 2 sighters and 10 shots for record in a time limit of 12 minutes.

Stage 2: 200 yards, 2 sighters in 2 minutes, 1 ten-shot string rapid fire, standing to sitting or kneeling position, time limit, 60 seconds.

Stage 3: 300 yards, 2 sighters in 2 minutes, 1 ten-shot string rapid fire, standing to prone, time limit, 70 seconds.

Stage 4: 600 yards, prone position, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record in a time limit of 22 minutes.

Aggregate: Sum of stages 1,2,3 & 4.

COLORADO REGIONAL HIGH POWER RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIPS JUNE 29 & 30 JULY 1, 2001

Blazing hot weather and scores, wonderful people in close competition made for a super Regional Championship. The Championship was fired over three days, June 29 through July 1 and 63 shooters participated. The Friday event was the Col. Walt Smith Trophy Match, which is primarily a service rifle match with NRA match rifle categories. Saturday was the Regional Championship with no awards division between types of rifles except when there were enough to sub divide a class such as the Master class. Sunday was devoted to a practice match, the Leg Warmer, then the CMP Leg Match shot concurrently with "Mid's Match where competitors can shoot along with the Leg match competitors using NRA match rifles. The following are highlights of each event in chronological order.
