"Mister National Champion"

Isaac Dow Wins Big At the National High Power Rifle Championships

For those who compete in sports, winning a national championship, while a goal of many serious athletes, is something that few will ever experience. For those fortunate and skilled enough to attain such heights in their chosen disciplines, the questions of "Can I do this again?" and "How do I accomplish it?" come to mind.

Isaac Dow is one of the select few who not only knows the answers to both of those questions, but also what it takes to go above and beyond to reach the pinnacle of competitive excellence. Having held on to his title of "Junior National Champion" from last year, he has experienced the feeling of what it is like to go down in the record books as one of the most successful competitive marksmen in the history of his sport: High Power Rifle Shooting.

Dow, who is a member of the Grand Valley Marksmen (GVM) shooting team in Grand Junction, recently returned from three weeks of competition where he bested his previous win and set a new national record as part of his unprecedented performance at the 2013 National High Power Rifle Championships, which were conducted from July 27th through August 14th at Camp Perry, Ohio.

The championship matches are sponsored by both the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) and the National Rifle Association of America (NRA.) The competitions are held on the ranges of Camp Perry, Ohio, which is an Ohio National Guard facility on the shores of Lake Erie. These same matches have been conducted on an annual basis at Camp Perry since 1906 and are considered to be the "World Series of Rifleman". The matches are contested by the top civilian and military shooters from the United States, including the very best marksmen from teams in the

US Army, Marine Corps, Air Force, Navy, Coast Guard, as well as their reserve and National Guard components.

The High Power Championships are divided into three phases, each of which have their own particular courses of fire and awards. The first phase, known as the National Trophy Rifle Matches, are sponsored by the Civilian Marksmanship Program and see over 5000 entrants over the course of a week's worth of firing competition.

The rifle which Dow used in the first two phases is an accurized version of the popular AR-15 semiautomatic rifle. Chambered for the .223 Remington cartridge, and equipped with precision sights, a stainless steel match-grade barrel, and a custom tuned trigger, the rifle is capable of placing a string of twenty shots into a group no bigger than six inches in diameter at a distance of 600 yards from the muzzle, which happens to be the longest distance that the matches in the first two weeks are conducted at.

This year Dow repeated his 2012 win to hold onto his title of CMP National Junior Champion. The title comes from placing first in an aggregate of several of the National Trophy Rifle Matches. The matches, which include the President's Rifle Match, The National Trophy Individual Match, and the National Junior Trophy Team Match, involve rifle shooting at paper targets located at distances between 200 and 600 yards from the shooters.

As with last year, Dow managed to win his Junior Champion title, in part, by securing the top spot amongst all other junior competitors in the President's Rifle Match. This year he improved his final standing in the event by placing fourth overall out of 1243 competitors entered in the tournament, eclipsing his finish from 2012, where he placed sixth overall in the match. His final score of 391-11X this year is a new junior national record high score for the course of fire.

Dow was also awarded the coveted "President's 100" medal for finishing in the top 100 spots of the overall competitor ranks in the President's Rifle Match. Three other former GVM shooters have earned President's 100 medals, those being Kyle Alstatt and Matt Sigrist in 2003, as well as Kyle Fiegel in 2006.

In the National Rifle Association sponsored portion of the National Championships, Dow most decidedly did not rest on his laurels from the previous week and last year's junior championship win. Over the course of the four day competition, which features a 2400 point aggregate, Dow managed to outshoot his previous best score in the event by 39 points. When the smoke settled on the final day of competition, his score of 2359-91X, was good enough to make him not only the NRA Junior Champion, but also the Collegiate and Civilian Champion as well.

For his wins in the NRA High Power Championship, Dow was presented with the Jackson Arms, Civilian Club, and VFG trophies, as well as gold National Championship medallions.

During the NRA Long Range Championship, which is the third and final phase of the National Championships, Dow used a .308 caliber bolt action rifle to shoot at targets located at distances of 800, 900, and 1000 yards from the firing line. Using only non-telescopic sights (aka.: "iron sights") to aim at the black colored bullseyes in the centers of the targets is quite a challenge, but for Dow, and his sharp young eyes, it was a challenge successfully overcome as he placed first in the Junior category of three of the individual matches, earning him three more NRA trophy plaques, and another personal best aggregate score for himself in the Long Range Championship.

The Grand Valley Marksmen team has had its share of championship winning junior shooters over the fourteen year history of its high power rifle competition program. During that time, members of

the team have won numerous tournaments at the local, state, and national levels, as well as having set and tied national records. Several of the individuals from the GVM have been members of teams which have won national championship team titles in years past. Isaac Dow, however, managed to eclipse all of those awards from all of the previous GVM shooters combined in the course of three weeks' worth of competition this year at the National Championships.

Even though this year was the last one of eligibility for Dow to be able to compete in the Junior category, it will not be the end of his competitive shooting career. He will again attend and compete at National Championships in Ohio next year, as well as at the World Long Range Rifle Championship, which will be held in 2015, and hosted on the same ranges at Camp Perry.

Dow will compete both for himself in the individual matches, and also as a member of the USA Young Eagles, which is a team composed of young American high school and college aged long range rifle shooters like himself. Dow and his teammates will go up against teams from across the world at the championship in 2015, with Australia, Canada, Great Britain, and South Africa being some of the nations who will field teams at the event. There the USA Young Eagles team will be the one to beat, as the team won the same event, and took the World Championship U25 title in Australia in 2011, which was the last time the World Championship was held.

As for his immediate future, Dow has already put down his rifle and picked up his textbooks as he began his sophomore year at Colorado Mesa University this week. While his courses will be challenging and studying will no doubt consume most of his time in the "off season", thoughts of his incredible experiences at the nationals this summer, as well as of future success, will no doubt always be present as a reminder that he has accomplished, and can again accomplish the goals he has set out for himself, no matter how hard the challenges have been, or will be.
