

Buffalo Creek Steel Challenge By: David Stockton

Clank, Clank, Clank. What is that sound you hear? It's the sound of lead hitting a steel plate.

In the event you have not heard the news, the BCGC has formed a Steel Challenge Club (SCC) as a separate entity within the overall Buffalo Creek Gun Club. There were three competitions held during the last three months of 2014 and they were open to all club members. As word got out, participation increased quite a bit. In fact, during the December match we had 22 shooters.

The Steel Challenge Match is a way to test your marksmanship skills while controlling the surge of adrenalin created during any competitive event. You are really shooting against the clock at a predefined course commonly known as a "stage." A stage consists of five plates, one of which is a stop plate. If a plate is missed the shooter gets a 3 second penalty if he/she chooses to go to the next target without a successful hit. The "stop plate" signifies the end of the string or round. If the "stop plate" is missed the shooter incurs a 30



second time scored, which is the maximum allowed.

The meets welcome shooters of all skill levels; they are fun and can be lively. We abide by SCSA rules for our matches with a couple of exceptions to assist less experienced shooters. For instance, in matches outside our club shooters must draw their pistol from a holster. Recognizing that not everyone is comfortable with that, we allow shooters to have their guns drawn and pointed at a designated safe spot prior to the clock starting if they choose to do so.

Again, it is a timed event - the whole idea is to have a bit of fun and to test your skills in a semi-stressedl event. The target arrays are about 12 to 25 yards from the shooting box. They look smaller than they are but you can hit them with a single attempt. You'll find three people on the course during a shooters round – the shooter, the Safety Officer who is also the time keeper and a score keeper.

The plan is to have two competitions per month starting in March. We will have one on the first Thursday and third Saturday of each month.

One of the ranges will be closed between 11:00 am and range closure to accommodate the event. Also, there will be a class held in the spring to teach you how to shoot in a competitive environment. I along with the members of the BCGC SCC want to encourage you to participate in these matches. I can't tell you how much fun it is. YOU just have to come out and experience it for yourself. Match sign up on the BCGC website is mandatory and shooters who have not previously participated in a Steel Challenge Match will attend a safety briefing at 10:30 am.

BUFFALO CREEK GUN CLUB INTRODUCTION TO .22 RIMFIRE BENCH REST SHOOTING

This is an introduction to .22 rimfire benchrest shooting using the <u>USBR 50 yard target</u> - three sighting and 25 record bulls. This match will generally follow the US Rimfire Benchrest Association Rules.

We will have eight positions setup at 50 yards for the experienced (Target Class) shooters and four positions set up at 25 yards for new shooters. Any .22 rimfire rifle with any sight may be used.

The course will consist of unlimited sighters and 25 shots for record.

Front rest, if used, must be topped with some form of sandbag. Sandbags must be made of leather or cloth. Front and rear rests, if used, will not be connected to each other, the bench or the rifle.

One round only will be loaded directly into the rifle or one round may be loaded into a magazine and the magazine reloaded for every shot.

This will be a relay match capable of accommodating a total of 12 shooters per relay - eight at 50 yards and four at 25 yards.

MATCH SCHEDULE:

- Competitor target assignment 8:45 to 9:00
- Equipment setup, instruction, unlimited sighters and target replacement 9:00 to 9:30 (First Relay)
- 25 shots for record with unlimited sighters 9:30 to 9:55
- Cycle will repeat if there are additional relays

EQUIPMENT NEEDED

.22 rimfire rifle with appropriate ammunition Eye and ear protection Sand bags and rest if desired Empty chamber indicator (will be provided if you do not have one) Spotting scope, binoculars or rifle scope capable of seeing .22 rimfire holes at 25 or 50 yards.
